Brad Newman

Brad Newman was appointed to the Montana State Board of Pardons and Parole as a Board Member for an initial term by then Governor Steve Bullock in 2018. Member Newman was appointed to a second term by Governor Greg Gianforte in 2023. Member Newman has accumulated over 37 years of extensive work experience in the Criminal Justice System, Criminal Law, and Corrections involving frequent work with victim impact, mental health, and American Indian cultural issues.

Board Member Newman graduated first in his class at the University of Montana School of Law in 1984. He served as Chief Deputy County Attorney for Butte-Silver Bow County, Montana from 1987-2006. During this time, he also served two terms in the Montana House of Representatives from 2000-2004, as well as serving a term with the Montana Board of Crime Control. Member Newman then served as District Court Judge for Montana Second Judicial District from 2007 until stepping down to accept an appointment to the Montana Board of Pardons and Parole in 2018.
